CREEDS

The Apostles Creed in its earliest form was recited in the second century by the Christian church. Tyrannius Rufinus comments around 390 AD, the viewpoint that the apostles wrote the creed together after Pentecost, before leaving Jerusalem to preach. This creed represents core Christian beliefs. This creed has been recited by the church for more that 1600 years and we join with the saints of old in declaring these foundational truths.

The Apostles Creed

I believe in God, the Father Almighty, Maker of heaven and earth; And in Jesus Christ, His only begotten Son, our Lord; Who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary; Suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; He descended into hell*;

The third day He rose again from the dead;

He ascended into heaven,

and is seated at the right hand of God the Father Almighty;

He will come again to judge the living and the dead.

I believe in the Holy Spirit; the holy catholic** church, the communion of saints; the forgiveness of sins; the resurrection of the body; and the life everlasting. Amen.

**Small "c" catholic refers to the universal church or the global church. It does not refer to the Roman Catholic church, big "C".

^{*}The Westminster standards question 50 asks, Wherein consisted Christ's humiliation after his death? Answer: Christ's humiliation after his death consisted in his being buried1, and continuing in the state of the dead, and under the power of death till the third day2; which has been otherwise expressed in these words, he descended into hell.

The Nicene Creed was established at the First Council of Nicea in AD 325. It is a universal christian declaration of faith held by Rome, Eastern Orthodox, Anglican, and most Protestant churches. It was written at the council as church fathers from all over Christendom came together to combat heresy regarding Christ. They joined in a final declaration that Christ is fully God and fully man, he is of the same substance as the Father, and he is not created. Hence, we stand with all of Christendom both past and present and declare this truth with them.

The Nicene Creed

I believe in one God, the Father Almighty, Maker of heaven and earth, and of all things visible and invisible.

And in one Lord Jesus Christ, the only begotten Son of God, begotten of the Father before all worlds; God of God, Light of Light, very God of very God; begotten, not made, being of one substance with the Father, by whom all things were made. Who, for us men and for our salvation, came down from heaven and was incarnate by the Holy Spirit of the virgin Mary, and was made man; and was crucified also for us under Pontius Pilate; he suffered and was buried; and the third day he rose again, according to the Scriptures; and ascended into heaven, and sits on the right hand of the Father; and he shall come again, with glory, to judge the living and the dead; whose kingdom shall have no end.

And I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord and Giver of life; who proceeds from the Father and the Son; who with the Father and the Son together is worshipped and glorified; who spoke by the prophets.

And I believe in one holy catholic* and apostolic church. I acknowledge one baptism for the remission of sins; and I look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.
